WHY IS DONATING BLOOD SO IMPORTANT?

Every 2 seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. Blood transfusions can be needed as the result of injury, surgery, childbirth, or treatment for cancer or other illnesses.

Whole blood can be separated into different components, including red blood cells, platelets, and plasma. Each component can be given to a different recipient, meaning that <u>one blood donor can help save three lives!</u>

Because the processing and testing of blood donations take time, blood products must be on the shelves and ready to use <u>before</u> they are needed. This ensures that enough blood will be available to stabilize patients in emergency situations.

Blood products have a shelf life. Red blood cells must be used within 42 days; platelets must be used within 5 days. This is why it is critical to maintain an adequate supply of blood products at all times.

DID YOU KNOW...

The American Red Cross has a program called Leaders Save Lives that is open to high school and college students. By hosting a blood drive during summer or winter periods when school is out of session, students have the opportunity to earn gift cards, or even win a scholarship!

Program dates in 2018:

Summer drives must run between June 1 and August 31, 2018 Winter drives must run between December 15, 2018 and January 15, 2019

During these periods, students who host blood drives that collect at least 25 pints can earn a \$50 gift card—or even greater rewards based on the number of pints collected—AND be entered to win scholarships that start at \$1,000!

Paying Tribute...

Please join us at our blood drive in Radnor Township on May 8 as we pay tribute to one of our exceptional donors.

Captain Matt LeTourneau exemplified heroism in numerous ways. He served as a firefighter and EMT in Delaware County before joining the Philadelphia Fire Department and rising through its ranks. As an instructor at the Delaware County Emergency Services Training Center, he trained firefighters from departments around the region. He devoted resources and time to volunteer groups, including the Philadelphia Second Alarmers, and his love of animals was evident in his support of several animal welfare organizations. On top of all that, he was a committed blood donor.



We are proud and honored that Captain LeTourneau was a regular donor at our blood drives. He came to donate even after working an overnight shift or before a long day of training other firefighters. He always arrived with a smile and often offered compliments as he left.

On January 6, Captain LeTourneau died in the line of duty while attempting to rescue the occupant of a burning home in North Philadelphia. As soon as we heard the news, we started thinking about ways that we could honor his service and pay our own tribute to him. Our blood drive in Radnor Township on May 8 will be dedicated to Captain LeTourneau, and we are proud to be spearheading a daylong campaign of blood drives that will honor his courage, his kindness, and his unwavering commitment to saving lives.
